Participation Report

Japanese Society of Gastroenterological Surgery (JSGS) is the leading association of GI surgeons in Japan with more than 20,000 members and a journal of its own. Indian Association of Surgical Gastroenterology (IASG) is the leading association of GI surgeons in India. IASG has an academic collaboration with JSGS under which speakers are invited from both societies in the annual national meetings of the two societies.
