Subject Nominations for NAMS Orations- 2019-2020

Dear Sir/Madam.

The Academy awards Orations to eminent Indian Biomedical Scientists for their outstanding contributions in the field of medical and related sciences every year. The details about various Orations are enclosed herewith.

As per Council decision, the nominations received for Orations will be considered for three consecutive years. In view of this, the candidates who had been nominated in 2017 and 2018 need not send their fresh nominations.

The Council in its meeting held on 30th July, 2014 made the following observations:-

"As decided earlier for the Orations, any bio-medical scientist who is awarded an Oration in a previous year, shall not be considered for the award of another Oration for a period of 10 years. Even after that period, he may be considered for the award of an Oration for a subject entirely unrelated to the one for which he was awarded for an earlier Oration. It is recommended that similar rule be incorporated for the Awards as nominations are being made for those who have received an award within the last 3 years. It is proposed that in case of Awards, those who received an Award shall not be renominated for a similar or a different Award for a period of at least 5 years; subsequently their nominations may be considered on merit".

A candidate who has been nominated for a particular Oration should not propose the name of any other candidate for the same Oration.

The Orations carry a scroll, cash award and a commemorative medal.

Nomination(s) are invited for the award of Orations in the Nomination Form enclosed (Eight Complete sets with Nomination Form) so as to reach the office of the undersigned latest by 24th June, 2019.
